Special Remarks on Chronic Effects on Humans:

May affect genetic material and may cause cancer based on animal data. No human data found. Indigo carmine was found to increase the incidence of sister chromatid exchange when tested in mice. Short term in vitro tests with indigo carmine have yielded conflicting results regarding its carcinogenicity, mutagenicity, and genotoxicity.

Special Remarks on other Toxic Effects on Humans:

Acute Potential Health Effects: Skin: May cause skin irritation. Eyes: May cause eye irritation and injury. This product contains a cationic dye. Similar dyes have caused permanent injury to the cornea and conjunctiva in documented cases with human or rabbit eyes. Inhalation: May cause respiratory tract irritation. Ingestion: May be harmful if swallowed. May cause gastrointestinal tract irritation with nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea. The toxicological properties of this substance have not been fully investigated.
